About the Project

Our Wednesday Stay and Play sessions provide a welcoming space for parents with children under 5. We offer a structured program that includes free-play, snack time, story-time circle and songs with the aim of supporting child development and community connections. The project is part of and contributes to our Families Project supporting local at-risk families and families living in temporary accommodation.

Role and Responsibilities (flexible depending on your interests and skills):

- Help the team to set up, run and pack away the stay and play
- Welcome families (especially new starters) and help keep the space safe in line with our risk assessment
- Build relationships with families attending the Stay and Play sessions and signpost to Round Chapel staff
- Assist in the kitchen, making teas and coffees, and preparing snacks.
- Run the Free Shop, set it up, keep it tidy and encourage people to make use of it
- Facilitate a craft/activity table or lead a singing or story-time session (if interested).

Person Specification - we are looking for someone who is:

- Kind, patient, enthusiastic, and interested in children and families. (Experience working with children is
 desirable but not required)
- Proactive, reliable, and able to commit to 3 Stay and Play sessions a month for at least 6 weeks.
- Calm, non-judgmental and empathetic
- Good at communicating with people and working in a team.
- Willing to attend safeguarding training outside of your volunteering hours.
